80 Hamilton Street Goderich, Ontario

*T*he home of “Thyme on 21” was built in the late 1870s by Mr. Samuel Sloane, an immigrant from Shercock County Coven, Ireland. Sloane, who moved to the Goderich area in 1861, was instrumental in the development of the Kensington Furniture Company as well as the Huron Savings and Loan Society. His ambitious nature also saw him through several terms on the Goderich Municipal Board. Mr. Sloane felt it necessary to contribute to his community, and his home still stands as a public monument to his efforts in the area.

*T*he house itself is one of the finest of its time. Three hand carved cherry fireplaces, imported from Ireland, still warm the restaurant on a cold winter’s night. On bright sunny days, the stained glass windows glisten with hand painted scenes of different species of birds. The beautiful cherry staircase, the old pump organ in the music room, and the guest washrooms in the old coal bin are just a few of this homes antiquities. The beautiful moulded ceilings are themselves a tribute to the masonry art of the 1800s.

*I*n 1902, Sloane sold the home to his nephew, Mr. A.J. Cooper, whose family resided here until 1976. For many years a grain warehouse was located on the northeast corner of the property to house Mr. Coopers granary business. It has since been demolished and the bricks were used in the construction of the property’s coach house.

*I*n November of 2004 Thyme on 21 opened its doors. We hope the combination of this beautiful Victorian home, Chef Terry Kennedy’s fresh and delicious menu and our staff’s desire to make every visit an enjoyable experience will keep you coming back Thyme and Thyme again.
